NOTICE OF INDEPENDENT CANDIDACY FOR THE U.S. SENATE



**Do No Construe Circumstances for Arrest
Where No Criminal Intent Exists.**

**Do Not Interfere With or Affect the
U.S. Senate Campaign of Don Hamrick.**



Being a poor man of the blue collar working class of society Don Hamrick is nevertheless eligible to run for the U.S. Senate to unseat Senator Mark Pryor. He will conduct his campaign as a poor man must by every cost effective means available with his grass roots style of campaigning directly to the People. This economically necessitated method of campaigning is dependent upon the humanitarian assistance of the People of Arkansas and of the People United States. This assistance with travel is a function of the First Amendment right to freedom of assembly and freedom of speech, and of the right to run for elected office, (i.e. *traveling by hitchhiking until campaign donations or donations "in kind" are sufficient to avoid hitchhiking*). Don Hamrick will visibly identify himself by wearing a "white hard hat" while carrying a "megaphone" for public speaking during the campaign.

TITLE 18. CRIMES AND CRIMINAL PROCEDURE Chapter 29—Elections and Political Activities

18 U.S.C. § 595. INTERFERENCE BY ADMINISTRATIVE EMPLOYEES OF FEDERAL, STATE, OR TERRITORIAL GOVERNMENTS

Whoever, being a person employed in any administrative position by the United States, or by any department or agency thereof, or by the District of Columbia or any agency or instrumentality thereof, or by any State, Territory, or Possession of the United States, or any political subdivision, municipality, or agency thereof, or agency of such political subdivision or municipality (including any corporation owned or controlled by any State, Territory, or Possession of the United States or by any such political subdivision, municipality, or agency), in connection with any activity which is financed in whole or in part by loans or grants made by the United States, or any department or agency thereof, uses his official authority for the purpose of interfering with, or affecting, the nomination or the election of any candidate for the office of President, Vice President, Presidential elector, Member of the Senate, Member of the House of Representatives, Delegate from the District of Columbia, or Resident Commissioner, shall be fined under this title or imprisoned not more than one year, or both.

This section shall not prohibit or make unlawful any act by any officer or employee of any educational or research institution, establishment, agency, or system which is supported in whole or in part by any state or political subdivision thereof, or by the District of Columbia or by any Territory or Possession of the United States; or by any recognized religious, philanthropic or cultural organization

ARKANSAS CODE 7-6-105.

***“Use of Sound Equipment”
“Penalty for Interference.”***

(a) When any citizen of Arkansas becomes a candidate in any primary or general election and complies with all the laws pertaining thereto, then the candidate shall be entitled to go into any city, town, municipality, or rural community in Arkansas and operate his or her acoustical or sound equipment between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. notwithstanding any town or city ordinance to the contrary.

(b) Any person who interferes in any manner with the right granted in this section shall be guilty of a Class B misdemeanor.
